Summary So Far...

 - ...through the Feasts of Israel,
 - ...the 'Messianic' Psalms
 - ...and through the Old Testament prophets

Summary So Far...

 In fulfillment of Gabriel's prophecy given to Daniel (ch9), Jesus presented Himself as the Messiah of Israel on the very day foretold over 500 years before!

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and allowed Himself to be worshipped as the Messiah
This was the <u>only</u> day in His ministry He allowed this, and He intentionally arranges the event
The Triumphal Entry was on the 10th of the month, the very day the sacrificial lamb's from the fields around Bethlehem were being taken and inspected, ready for sacrifice Ramat Rachel

Summary So Far...

- The Feast of Passover foreshadows Christ's sacrificial death
 - On the 14th day of the month (Nisan)
 - Jesus was able to both celebrate the Passover with His disciples & become the Passover Lamb, dying on the 14th because of Exodus 12:6
 - The lamb's must be killed 'Beyn' 'BETWEEN' the evenings – thus a 24 hour window
 - Paul states that Christ became our Passover 1 Corinthians 5:7

 The Feast of Unleavened Bread, His burial

 As Jesus body was placed in the tomb it became the 15th by the Jewish reckoning

If Dawkins is correct, one might imagine the following conversation . . .

Luke: Let's have another round of drinks. I've an idea I want to run past you. John: Sure. What's on your mind? Luke: You probably heard about the Nazarene named Jesus who was crucified yesterday. I think he could be the perfect candidate for our fake Messiah project. Mark: One tiny problem: he's dead!

Luke: Yes, but that means we'll control the narrative. We'll be in charge of his reputation.

Matthew: Who would follow a dead Messiah?

Luke: Nobody, so we'll begin with a resurrection myth. We'll hire some thugs to fight off the soldiers guarding his tomb so we can get rid of the corpse.

John: But a missing corpse isn't the same as a resurrection.

Luke: You're right, so we'll have to persuade Jesus's friends to spend the next 30 years telling everyone he's risen from the dead, even if sticking to that story means they'll be imprisoned or killed.

Mark: Okay, then what?

Luke: Well, to make a conspiracy credible you need precise details. So we'll invent stories where Jesus interacts with people in specific locations.

Matthew: Won't people just disprove the stories by visiting those places and asking around?

Luke: There's no need to worry about that. We could invent a story about a synagogue ruler's terminally ill daughter being healed, give the synagogue ruler a name, set it all in a particular place, and still no one absolutely no one, not even the people living in that place—would trouble to factcheck. Everyone would simply swallow the story whole!

Mark: It sounds like we're on safe ground there. But if we want people to follow Jesus, he'll need a message. People have been waiting for the Messiah for centuries. He's got to be worth listening to when he finally appears.

John: Good point. I'll cook up some deep quotes.

Luke: Thanks, John. Mark's right: you'll need to put profound wisdom on Jesus's lips that theological scholars can happily study for their entire careers.

John: Not a problem.

Luke: Guys, it will take us a while to put these documents together. We need to get communities of people worshiping Jesus in the meantime so that when our books come out they'll get a good reception.

Mark: There's a guy I know called Saul, he could help with that.

Luke: Saul the Pharisee? I can't imagine him getting involved with this kind of thing. Mark: Trust me, he's our man. I see him leaving behind everything he's been trained to do and planting congregations of Jesus worshipers throughout the Roman Empire, whatever it costs him personally-beatings, shipwrecks, and the like.


Matthew: Awesome. But Luke, can you just remind me, what's the point of all this? I mean, what exactly do we get out of this?



- They take Jesus, anoint Him, and put Him in Joseph's tomb






Topology of Mount Moriah



- And arrives first, seeing the grave clothes

 - No concern about defilement for him now
 - He had nothing left to lose!
- Peter notices, John records, the napkin

The Folded Napkin?

- Why did Jesus fold the linen burial cloth after His resurrection?
- Is it really significant?
- Yes!



- Jesus then reveals Himself to Mary

 Nothing had changed except Mary's perception
- Then Jesus meets the other women en route
- He bids them to hurry and tell the rest, and that He will meet them in Galilee

Why hurry?

 Because even now a rumour was circulating in Jerusalem:

The Royal Guard

- This "watch", was a royal roman guard made up of 16 highly trained roman soldiers
- Each would have a spear, a short sword, and a dagger,
- Each man also had 5 javelins inside of a curved shield
- Their primary weapon however was a sling
- They were trained to hit a target 70 ft. away
- They were the special forces of their day

The Royal Guard

- And if a commanding officer came and found just one of those guards asleep all 16 men in the guard would be killed
- So if one fell asleep the other guards would set their tunic on fire!
- In 390 A.D. as Rome was beginning to fall apart, the then Caesar commanded Flavius Viratus Ronitus (historian) to search the archives for military and tactical inspiration
- As a result he reconstructed this elite unit

The Royal Guard

- The tomb was sealed either with wax/clay
- Ropes would have been put across the stone, with the seal or Rome in the centre
- If anyone broke the seal, the punishment was to be crucified upside down,
- If they couldn't catch you, they would crucify upside down every man, woman and child in your village,
- That tomb was sealed and secure!

- In Israel there were tax collectors who would stay in their office and do the paperwork...
- And others who would go out and about and collect taxes from the public
- Matthew was the latter, called 'publicans' – Because they collected from the public,
- As a servant of Rome he would always have had a roman soldier with him
 - With his shield and his spear to signify the authority of Rome,

The Inside Story!

- Matthew is the only Gospel writer to tell us what happened at the tomb...
- ...that an angel came down, and rolled the stone away,
- ...and what happened in the discussion with Pilate...
- ...and that the soldiers didn't go to Pilate when they fled the tomb, but to the priests,
- ...and that the priests paid the soldiers to keep quiet!
