Setting The Scene

- From Gen 12 to Acts 2:
 - -It's all about Israel...
 - -and that God keeps His promises!
- "We need a doctrinal as well as devotional understanding of the Word of God" Chuck Missler

Setting The Scene

- Romans 8 opened with "no condemnation…"
 - -Closed with assurance there is no separation.
- If God is so faithful to His Word
 - -That none He has justified can be condemned;
 - -And that none in Him can be separated;
- Then why have the Israelites,
 - -who were sovereignly chosen by God
 - -and also given unconditional promises,

Fallen, been cast away and spiritually blinded?



I say the truth in Christ, I lie not, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Ghost,

That I have great heaviness and continual sorrow in my heart.

Israel and the Church

- Most Churches are ignorant of God's promises to Israel – leading to heresy
 - They believe the view that says God is finished with Israel.
 - The same view is held by Islam!
 - "Israel forfeited the promises God made to her"
 - "Those promises now belong to the Church"
- We noted last session that God has made unconditional promises to the Nation of Israel
- Israel will not (and cannot) be cast away!

Israel and the Church

- God's dealings with mankind (from Genesis 12 onwards) have been through, or with respect to the Nation of Israel.
- History has been played out with Israel as the centerpiece

- What if there was a mystery that spanned the ages?
- A mystery birthed in a Middle Eastern desert over three thousand years ago that is now determining the events of our day?
- What if I told you this mystery involves global leaders, heads of state, presidents, and many others who have all been working to a pre determined timetable?

- What if I could show you that this mystery has decided world events down to the year, the month and even the very day of their occurring?
- What if I showed you that everything that ever has been and all that will be are connected to and are part of this mystery?
- What if I showed you that you don't need faith to believe this mystery, because it is etched as a silent witness into our past, present and future?



- What if there was a people brought into existence as a sign, as a witness to the existence of God and as a vessel to bring about His purposes?

...let them be to mark 'the appointed times'

- Equidistant letter sequences should naturally occur at random in the text
- The more letters in a word, the less likely a word is to occur in the text
- The word 'Ha Moyadim' myd mh should statistically occur 5 times in the 78,064 letters of Genesis...but it doesn't!
- It occurs *only once*, and at equidistant letter sequence of 70
- It 'just so happens' to be centered on Genesis
 1:14

What is significant about the spacing of 70?

Israel had 70 Sabbaths according to the Law of Moses

- 52 weekly Sabbaths
- 7 days for Passover
- 1 day for the Feast of Pentecost
- 1 day for the Feast of Trumpets
- 1 day for the Feast of Atonement
- 7 days for the Feast of Tabernacles
- 1 day for the 'Eighth day of Assembly'

70

 The odds against this occurring by unaided chance have been estimated to be greater than 70,000,000 to one!

The First Day of Nisan

1st day of Israel's religious calendar

Theme: Cleansing and New Beginnings

- The dedication of the tabernacle Ex 40:2,17
- The cleansing of the temple by Hezekiah 2 Chron 29:17
- Ezra & the exiles begin their return home from Babylon Ezra 7:9
- The decree is given to Nehemiah to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem Nehemiah 2:1

The Tenth Day of Nisan

Theme: Sanctification

- The sanctification of the Passover lamb on the night of the Exodus Ex 12:3
- Israel crosses the Jordan & enters the promised land Joshua 4:19
- Christ was 'taken' as our Passover Lamb on Palm Sunday Luke 19:37-38
- Ezekiel's vision of the Millennial Temple Ezekiel 40:1

The Fourteenth Day of Nisan

Theme: Covenant relationship with God

- God's covenant with Abraham Gen 15:18 / Ex 12:41
- Passover supper eaten in Egypt Exodus 12:6
- The 1st Passover in Canaan (the Covenant renewed) Joshua 5:11-12
- The book of the Law found and reaffirmed under Josiah – 2 Chron 34:2-3
- The dedication of the 2nd Temple Ezra 6:16-19
- The last supper (the new covenant established)

The Fifteenth Day of Nisan

Theme: From Death to Freedom

- The departure from the place of death as Israel leave the bondage of Egypt and enter into a life of freedom Numbers 33:3
- Christ buried: "Unless a grain of wheat" John 12:24
- Masada: 960 men, women and children took their own lives so as not to be captured by the Roman army

The Seventeenth Day of Nisan

Theme: New Life!

- Noah's ark rests on the mountains of Ararat
 Gen 6:5
- Israel crosses the Red Sea Exodus 14:11-12
- Israel eats the Firstfruits of the Promised Land Joshua 5:10-12
- The Resurrection of Jesus

The Sixth Day of Sivan

Theme: New Revelation of God's Will

- The giving of the Law on Mt Sinai Exodus 19:11
 - 3000 people died
- The giving of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Acts 1:8
 - 3000 born again!
- "The letter kills by the Spirit gives <u>life!</u>" 2 Cor 3:6

The Seventeenth Day of Tammuz

Theme: The breaking of a spiritual symbol of God's favour

- Moses breaks the tables of the Law (re the Golden Calf) Exodus 32:19
- The Babylonian army breaks through the walls of Jerusalem causing the daily sacrifices to cease 587 B.C.
- The Roman armies attack on the Temple Mount forces the priests to stop the daily sacrifice A.D.70

The Ninth Day of Av

Theme: A Fast of Mourning

- This day of fasting known as Tisha Be-Av is a day of mourning and remembrance of Israel's loss of their sacred temple in 587 B.C.
- It is one of the most historically significant anniversaries in the life of their nation and is commemorated by Jews throughout the world as the tragic day when God withdrew his presence, and they wept as their precious temple burned to the ground.

The Ninth Day of Av

Theme: A Fast of Mourning

- 12 spies return from Canaan & their lack of faith results in the death of that generation Num 14:39
- The destruction of the 2nd temple by the Romans in A.D. 70
- Also the date of the ploughing with salt in A.D.71
- It marks the defeat of Shimon Bar-Kokhba's revolt and the expulsion of Jews from the Land AD135
- The same date England expelled all Jews 1290 A.D.
- The same date Spain expelled all Jews in 1492
- Declaration of the start of WW1 in 1914 which prompted Russian persecution of Jews

The Ninth Day of Av

Theme: A Fast of Mourning

- Just taking this one date, what is the chance that these 8 historical tragedies could have occurred by chance rather than by God's foreknowledge and sovereignty?
- For two events to occur: = 1 in 365
- For three events: $1 \times 365 \times 365 = 133,225$
- The odds that all 8 events would occur <u>by chance</u> alone on the 9th Av (rather than by God's design) is:
- One chance in 863,078,009,300,000,000
- 1 chance in 863 Zillion! (for just 8 events)
- There are more than 40 'anniversary events'



- Consider the start of a human life and the timetable of a human pregnancy...
- We will discover that the blueprint for this is hidden in the Feasts of Israel that were recorded thousands of years before medical science made the discoveries we now know.
- The best time to conceive is on the 14th day of a woman's cycle.
- If we compare this with the Feast of Passover, we realise that it also falls on the on the 14th of the month.

- The next feast is the Feast of Unleavened Bread, which according to Jewish law, must occur the next day.
- For pregnancy to occur the egg must be fertilized within 24 hours.
- Then follows The Feast of Firstfruits, which could fall anywhere from two to six days after the Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- Amazingly, once an egg is fertilized, it travels down the fallopian tube at it's own speed taking anything from two to six days to arrive safely at its destination in the womb.

- Next we have the Feast of Pentecost that occurs exactly fifty days after Firstfruits.
- From the point an embryo reaches the womb it starts to grow, but nothing dramatic changes until it becomes an actual foetus when it takes the form of a tiny baby.
- This happens exactly 50 days later!

- It is no coincidence that 50 days after Christ's resurrection on the Feast of Firstfruits, the Church took on the appearance of a body as a result of the coming of the Holy Spirit.
- The Church technically began at Firstfruits when Jesus rose bringing new life to all who would accept it, but it wasn't until Pentecost that it had a noticeable structured form.

- Once a baby has passed the 50th day, the growth is gradual with nothing momentous happening until the 1st day of the 7th month.
- According to medical textbooks, on the 1st day of the 7th month the baby's hearing is fully developed.
- The baby can then distinguish one sound from another.
- ...for example, a trumpet can be heard as a trumpet.
- Any guesses as to the next feast of Israel?

- "And the LORD spoke unto Moses, saying, Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, In the seventh month, in the first day of the month, shall ye have a sabbath, a memorial of blowing of trumpets, an holy convocation". (Leviticus 23:23-24)
- This is the Feast of Trumpets!
- Now all this could be just coincidence, but then again.....let's continue.

 "And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, Also on the tenth day of this seventh month there shall be a day of atonement"

(Leviticus 23:26-27).

- So the 10th day of the 7th month was to be the Feast of Atonement.
- The next significant event in the development of an unborn child occurs....
- ...yes you guessed it, on the 10th day of the 7th month!

- At this stage there are important changes in the blood and it is necessary for the foetal blood, which carried the mother's oxygen through the baby's system, to change in such a way that the baby can carry the oxygen that it will obtain upon birth.
- Technically, the haemoglobin of the blood has to change from that of a foetus to that of a self-respirating and circulating human being.

- A foetus doesn't breathe, but rather depends on the oxygen obtained through the mother's blood circulation.
- Naturally, this system must be changed before birth, and that change occurs according to the textbooks, in the 2nd week of the 7th month, and to be precise, on the 10th day.
- It is on that day according to the Mosaic Law, that the high priest takes the blood into the holy of holies and presents it as an atonement for the sins of Israel.

- Leviticus17:11 puts it this way, "For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes an atonement for the soul".
- So, we've now reached the 10th day of the seventh month in the development of a human child, but the baby is not ready to be born.

- One more development is yet to occur, which coincides perfectly with the 15th day of the 7th month, which in the Law of Moses is when the Feast of Tabernacles is celebrated.
- At this point the lungs are developed; this is a major step in the development of a child because once the lungs are operating, even if then born prematurely, the child stands a very good chance of survival.

- This is an incredible picture of the feast of tabernacles!
- The tabernacle is the 'house of the Spirit'.
- The Hebrew word for 'Spirit' is the same word that is translated 'breath'.
- So tabernacle is literally the 'house of breath', and the lungs are indeed the 'tabernacle' of the breath
- God breathed breath into Adam to make him become a living soul and Jesus breathed on the disciples and said: "Receive the Holy Spirit" (John 20:22)

- At this point 'our baby' could survive and is now as good as ready for birth, but we've only reached 200 days and a normal pregnancy should last 280 days.
- The Feast of Tabernacles however, marks the end of the Levitical feasts as recorded in Leviticus 23
- Is there anything in the Jewish calendar that occurs at 280 days?

- Amazingly, on the 280th day of the Jewish calendar we come to another feast, not one of the Mosaic feasts, but rather one that was added much later - the Feast of Dedication, or Hanukkah as it is called today.
- In Daniel.8:9-14 we read that an 'abomination of desolation' would result in the daily sacrifice in the temple being taken away. This prophecy was fulfilled in 167 BC when a Selucian ruler called Antiochus Epiphanes captured Jerusalem and desecrated the Jewish Temple, sacrificing a pig on the alter.

- However as Daniel had prophesied, after 2,300 days the sanctuary was cleansed thanks to the revolt against Antiochus led by Judas Maccabees.
- When the Jews finally entered the temple they found only one days supply of the precious consecrated oil that was needed to maintain the light on the seven-branched lampstand called the 'Menorah'.
- Under the Law of Moses this was to be kept continually burning.

- The priests poured the precious oil into the seven lamps and lit them to bring forth light. However, it would be 8 days before more oil could be supplied. During those 8 days a miracle occurred; the one days supply lasted for 8 days!
- So in honour of the miracle of light, the Jewish people added the Feast of Dedication to their calendar - on the 280th day.

 Whilst not specifically given by God, the validity of this feast is confirmed in John 10:22. It is on this day that the (textbook) pregnancy ends when a baby is born and sees the light for the first time!

- Thus we have the feasts of Israel and the pregnancy cycle in harmony.
- As the medical knowledge necessary to verify this was not known until recently, and the feasts of Israel were established thousands of years ago...
- ...the only logical conclusion can be that both were intentionally designed by the same Author to validate God's Word.
- So, we see the not only history, but life itself is intertwined with the Nation of Israel and her 'appointed times'!

- Historical right land of their fathers

- Practical value the desert is now fruitful Isaiah 32:10-15 / 41:18-19 / 43:19-20

- Balance the only democracy in the Middle East
- Religious right Israel 2565x, Jerusalem 811x
- Divine right the God of Heaven said so!

Land Covenant

Gen 12:7; 13:12-17; 15:9-21; 35:9-12

 Due to failure under the Mosaic Covenant, worldwide dispersion predicted:

Deut 28:63-68; 30:1-3; ["When" not "If"]

Lev 26:40-45 [v.42 contrasts the conditional Mosaic covenant with the *unconditional* covenants]

Regathering:

Ezek 36:17-32 [v.25 "then", before repentance]

- How will they know He is the Lord?
- Because He keeps His promises despite their failures!
 We, also, are not on a merit system.
- Declared to be everlasting:

Eze 16:60-63 "His Land." "His City."

Covenants

- 1. The Abrahamic Covenant
- 2. The Land Covenant
- 3. The Davidic Covenant
 - -2 Samuel 7 7x 'Everlasting kingdom'
 - The Throne of David Luke 1:32
 - Critical issue: "a-millennialism," is the dominant eschatological view in most denominations - not just a side issue!
 - It is a dangerous deception!

The Davidic Covenant

Throne of David will be re-established

- in Jerusalem
- This was also emphasized to Abraham

Gen 17:2-8

- David to rule in the Millennium

Ez 34:23,24; 37:24,25; Hos 3:5

- Cannot be applied to the Church: Ez 37:21-28
- It will begin with the relief of nature's curse:

Isa 11:1-13; 65:17-24; Micah 4:1-5 Zeph 3:14-20; Zech 14:1-21

Covenants

- 3. The Davidic Covenant
- 4. The Everlasting Covenant

- Four <u>Unconditional</u> Covenants: essential to understanding both OT and NT.
- 1. Abrahamic Covenant Most important:

Gen 12:2,3

Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:

And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

- Seven "I Wills": 4 direct, and 3 understood
- From this flows God's plan for all of mankind!
 - -All the other covenants build on this one.

And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:

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

- Caponius appointed Procurator
 - The legal power of the Sanhedrin was immediately restricted and the adjudication of capital cases was lost. This was normal Roman policy.
 Josephus, Wars of the Jews, 2:8

After the death of the procurator Festus, when Albinus was about to succeed him, the high priest Ananius considered it a favorable opportunity to assemble the Sanhedrin. He therefore caused James, the brother of Jesus, who was called Christ, and several others, to appear before this hastily assembled council, and pronounced upon them the sentence of death by stoning. All the wise men and strict observers of the law who were at Jerusalem expressed their disapprobation of this act...

 Some even went to Albinus himself, who had departed to Alexandria, to bring this breach of the law under his observation, and to inform him that Aranius had acted illegally in assembling the Sanhedrin without the Roman authority.



- During the war, when the British and the Allies were fighting the Germans and the Ottoman Turks, Major T.E. Lawrence organized his widely publicized "Arab Revolt."
- General Allenby was ultimately victorious in the Middle East and so the League of Nations awarded the British a "Mandate" on April 25, 1920 (which was to endure until May 14, 1948).
- In 1921 an aggressive young man named Abdallah, the son of Sharif Hussein of Mecca in Arabia, moved into the land east of Jordan river with his troops. The British Colonial Secretary recognized Abdallah as the "Emir of Trans-Jordan." Abdallah then consolidated control with his British-trained "Arab Legion."

Jordan



- In 1946 after the war, Abdallah was crowned King of Trans-Jordan.
 - (Since 1999, his great-grandson, Abdullah II, is the current king).
- In 1948 Jordan joined the attack against Israel in its War of Independence and successfully fought the *Haganah* and held the "West Bank."
 - In 1967, however, again joining Egypt in the Six-Day War, they lost it.
- In 1998, having previously repudiated any rights to the "West Bank," Jordan signed a Peace Treaty with Israel at Camp David.

A Mysterious Exception

- 1922 League of Nations officially ratifies British Mandate over Palestine with aim of building Jewish National Home. Churchill White Paper creates "Trans-Jordan" east of Jordan
 - Churchill White Paper creates "Trans-Jordan" east of Jordan River, taking 78% of land allocated for British Mandate.
- 1925 Vladimir Jabotinsky founds Zionist Revisionism, forerunner of the Herut political party and the modern Likud Party.
- 1929 Arab riots in Palestine. Massacre of Jews in Hebron and Safed. Arabs demand end to Jewish immigration.
- 1930 British White Paper limits Jewish immigration to Palestine.
- 1933 Hitler comes to power in Germany.
- 1935 The Nuremberg Laws
- 1936-39 Campaign of Arab violence in Palestine. Arab rioters murder 500 Jews and thousands of Arabs, demanding an end to Jewish immigration. Arab nationalist movements riot to stop Jewish homeland in Palestine; throw their support to Hitler in World War II.



- 1937 British Peel Commission asserts that Jewish National Home cannot be built in Palestine. Recommends repartition of Palestine into tiny Jewish state (5% of total area) and Arab state in remainder.
 - Peel Plan is rejected by both Arabs and Jews. Britain halts Jewish immigration to Palestine, condemning millions of European Jews to Holocaust.
- 1938 Munich Conference and betrayal of the Czechs. Hitler is given the Sudetenland.
- 1939 Hitler overruns Czechoslovakia.
 - Chamberlain White Paper announces end to Jewish National Home and promises control of immigration into Palestine to the Arabs within five years.
 - British blockade Palestine against "illegal" Jewish immigration.

Hitler invades Poland. World War II begins.



- 1941 Mufti relocates to Berlin. Meets with Hitler; announces intention of creating "fascist" Arab state, and agitates for the destruction of world Jewry. Instigates terrorism against Arab moderates also.
- 1942 Nazi conference at Wannsee decides on destruction of all Jews in Europe.
- 1944 Jewish Brigade, part of the British forces, fights alongside the Allies.
- 1945 World War II ends.
 - Liberation of the death camps where six million Jews died. Arabs demand end to Jewish immigration to Palestine. "Illegal" smuggling of Holocaust survivors into Palestine by Jews. Increase of Jewish underground actions against British blockade and British administration in Palestine.
- 1946 Irgun bombs King David Hotel.



1947 Britain announces withdrawal from Palestine.
United Nations announces partition into Jewish and Arab states.

Dead Sea Scrolls discovered.

1948 Invasion of Arab forces aimed at preventing the establishment of the Jewish State.

Declaration of independence of the State of Israel. David Ben Gurion first Prime Minister.

1948-49 Israel's War of Independence. Arab armies from five countries invade Israel. Jordanian forces occupy Judea, Samaria, and eastern half of Jerusalem, including Old City and Temple Mount; Jordan annexes East Jerusalem; destroying all Jewish settlements. Egypt occupies Gaza. War of Independence ends in Jewish victory.



- 1948-52 800,000 Jews expelled from Arab countries. Most flee to Israel and are absorbed. 650,000 Arabs flee from Israel and are confined to refugee camps.
- 1951 Yasser Arafat of the Husseini clan begins organizing Palestinian radicals in Cairo and recruits Abu Iyad, Abu Jihad, and other future leaders of the PLO.
- 1952-56 Terrorist raids into Israel from adjoining Arab states, including Egyptian-sponsored fedayeen raids from Gaza. Israeli army adopts policy of reprisals.
- 1956 Sinai Campaign, Oct 29 Nov 5. Gamal Abdel Nasser nationalizes Suez Canal and blocks Israeli shipping. Israel captures Sinai from Egypt. Terrorist bases in Gaza dismantled. U.S.-Soviet pressure forces Israeli withdrawal from Sinai without peace treaty. Dwight Eisenhower guarantees protection of Israeli shipping.



- 1964 PLO is founded in Cairo with aim of "liberating" Palestine. PLO Charter calling for Israel's destruction adopted. Campaign of terror attacks across Israel's borders escalates.
- 1967 Egypt floods Sinai with troops and blockades Israeli shipping in the Red Sea. American guarantee to protect Israel fails to take effect.

Six Day War, June 5-10. Israel defeats combined forces of Egypt, Syria, Iraq, and Jordan. Captures Sinai and Gaza, Judea and Samaria, and the Golan Heights. Jerusalem is reunited. Jewish settlements in eastern Jerusalem, Judea, and Samaria reestablished.
