- David is now old
- Adonijah appoints himself to be king
 - Supported by Joab
- Nathan & Bathsheba (fearing for theirs and Solomon's life) petition David
- David then appoints Solomon as king
 - He rides David's mule through Jerusalem
- Adonijah's supporters flee, he is spared

- Solomon is charged by David regarding his primary responsibility:
 - Be strong
 - Walk in God's ways

3 keep his statutes, and his commandments, and his judgments, and his testimonies, as it is written in the law of Moses, that thou mayest prosper in all that thou doest, and whithersoever thou turnest thyself

- Solomon is also charged by David with some 'housekeeping' tasks
 - Deal with Joab
 - Guilty of the murder of Abner
 - Now also guilty of treason
 - Show kindness to Barzillai
 - Who blessed and supported David when he fled from Absalom
 - Deal with Shimei
 - Who cursed David when he fled from Absalom

- Adonijah then commits treason and is put to death
- Abiathar (priest) is removed from office
 - To "fulfil the word of the LORD, which he spake concerning the house of Eli in Shiloh" 1 Kings 2:27
- Joab is also killed for his act of treason
- Shimei is put under house arrest in Jerusalem, but later leaves and is put to death
- Finally the kingdom is established

Solomon's first mistake

- Moses warned that any king should not:
 - multiply horses to himself,
 - nor cause the people to return to Egypt, to the end that he should multiply horses: forasmuch as the LORD hath said unto you, Ye shall henceforth return no more that way.
 - Neither shall he multiply wives to himself, that his heart turn not away:
 - neither shall he greatly multiply to himself silver and gold.
 Deuteronomy 17:14-20

- Solomon made an alliance with the king of Egypt and took Pharaoh's daughter as his wife.
- Nevertheless:
 - "Solomon loved the LORD, walking in the statutes of David his father" 1 Kings 3:3

5 In Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night: and God said, Ask what I shall give thee.

6 And Solomon said, Thou hast shewed unto thy servant David my father great mercy, according as he walked before thee in truth, and in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart with thee; and thou hast kept for him this great kindness, that thou hast given him a son to sit on his throne, as it is this day.

- 7 And now, O LORD my God, thou hast made thy servant king instead of David my father: and I am but a little child: I know not how to go out or come in.
- 8 And thy servant is in the midst of thy people which thou hast chosen, a great people, that cannot be numbered nor counted for multitude.

1 Kings 3:5-14

Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this thy so great a people?

10 And the speech pleased the Lord, that Solomon

had asked this thing.

In And God said unto him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life; neither hast asked riches for thyself, nor hast asked the life of thine enemies; but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment; Behold, I have done according to the words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee. 13 And I have also given thee that which thou hast not asked, both riches, and honour: so that there shall not be any among the kings like unto thee all

thy days.


14 And if thou wilt walk in my ways, to keep my statutes and my commandments, as thy father David did walk, then I will lengthen thy days.

The Temple – 1 Kings 5-7

- David desired to build a 'house for God'
 - 2 Samuel 7
- God said to David was not to build it himself, but his son would do it
- Solomon now begins the work
 - He obtains Cedars from Lebanon
 - David had a close relationship with Hiram
 - Solomon has a workforce of 183,300
 - 30,000 men (10,000 per/month shift)
 - 70,000 carriers
 - 80,000 hewers in the mountains
 - 3,300 supervisors








Our Personal Architecture?


- 7 Times declared: "Ye are the Temple of God"

"Christ Himself is the builder of His spiritual temple, and He has built it on the mountains of His unchangeable affection, His omnipotent grace, and His infallible truthfulness. But as it was in Solomon's temple, so in this; the materials need making ready".

"There are the 'Cedars of Lebanon,' but they are not framed for the building; they are not cut down, and shaped, and made into those planks of cedar, whose odoriferous beauty shall make glad the courts of the Lord's house in Paradise. There are also the rough stones still in the quarry, they must be hewn thence, and squared. All this is Christ's own work"

"Each individual believer is being prepared, and polished, and made ready for his place in the temple; but Christ's own hand performs the preparation-work. 

- Then spake Solomon, The LORD said that he would dwell in thick darkness.
- Is I have surely built thee an house to dwell in, a settled place for thee to abide in for ever.
- And the king turned his face about, and blessed all the congregation of Israel: (and all the congregation of Israel stood;)

15 And he said, Blessed be the LORD God of Israel, which spake with his mouth unto David my father, and hath with his hand fulfilled it, saying, 16 Since the day that I brought forth my people Israel out of Egypt, I chose no city out of all the tribes of Israel to build an house, that my name might be therein; but I chose David to be over my people Israel.

- And it was in the heart of David my father to build an house for the name of the LORD God of Israel.

- 26 And now, O God of Israel, let thy word, I pray thee, be verified, which thou spakest unto thy servant David my father.

27 But will God indeed dwell on the earth? behold, the heaven and heaven of heavens cannot contain thee; how much less this house that I have builded?

28 Yet have thou respect unto the prayer of thy servant, and to his supplication, O LORD my God, to hearken unto the cry and to the prayer, which thy servant prayeth before thee to day:

- 19 That thine eyes may be open toward this house night and day, even toward the place of which thou hast said, My name shall be there: that thou mayest hearken unto the prayer which thy servant shall make toward this place.

39 Then hear thou in heaven thy dwelling place, and forgive, and do, and give to every man according to his ways, whose heart thou knowest; (for thou, even thou only, knowest the hearts of all the children of men;)

that sinneth not,) and thou be angry with them, and deliver them to the enemy, so that they carry them away captives unto the land of the enemy, far or near;

 These words are quoted by Daniel in captivity in Babylon (Dan ch9)

48 And so return unto thee with all their heart, and with all their soul, in the land of their enemies, which led them away captive, and pray unto thee toward their land, which thou gavest unto their fathers, the city which thou hast chosen, and the house which I have built for thy name: 49 Then hear thou their prayer and their supplication in heaven thy dwelling place, and maintain their cause,

50 And forgive thy people that have sinned against thee and all their transgressions wherein they have transgressed against thee, and give them compassion before them who carried them captive, that they may have compassion on them: 51 For they be thy people, and thine inheritance, which thou broughtest forth out of Egypt, from the midst of the furnace of iron:

1 Kings 8:46-54

- That thine eyes may be open unto the supplication of thy servant, and unto the supplication of thy people Israel, to hearken unto them in all that they call for unto thee.
- For thou didst separate them from among all the people of the earth, to be thine inheritance, as thou spakest by the hand of Moses thy servant, when thou broughtest our fathers out of Egypt, O Lord GOD.

And it was so, that when Solomon had made an end of praying all this prayer and supplication unto the LORD, he arose from before the altar of the LORD, from kneeling on his knees with his hands spread up to heaven.

- Solomon appeals to God's covenant, faithfulness, character, sovereignty, obligation
 - "Thy people" x12 "Thy servant" x9

Royal Visitation - 1 Kings 10

- The Queen of Sheba comes to Jerusalem on account of the fame of Solomon
- He is tested with questions



1 Kings 11

- "But king Solomon loved many strange women..." v1
- Solomon had 700 wives + 300 concubines
- "And Solomon did evil in the sight of the LORD" v6
- As a result the LORD declares He will 'rend' the kingdom from Solomon
- Just Judah will be left for David's posterity (+ Benjamin)

Jeroboam's Folly

- God grants Jeroboam sovereignty over 10 tribes
- Fearful that the people would return to Rehoboam, Jeroboam sets up centres of worship in Dan and Bethel
 - These become centres of idolatry
- He appoints the 'lowest of the people' as priests
- God sends a prophet to warn Jeroboam

10 Lost Tribes Myth

- The godly 'up north' travel to Rehoboam in the south – 2 Chron 11
- The idol worshipers in the south go up to Jeroboam in the north.
- All 12 tribes are evident in post-exile records
 - Ezra, Nehemiah, et al
- New Testament confirmations
 - Anna (Asher), Paul (Acts 26:7),
 - James writes to the 12 tribes, Rev 7,12,21



Elijah

(Last 6 chapters of 1st Kings)

- Ministry to the Northern Kingdom
- NT speaks of him more than any other OT prophet
- Appears twice in NT:

 Transfiguration Mat
--

- Two Witnesses Rev 11
- 8 Major Miracles
 - Suspension of rain for 3 ½ years
 1 Kings 17
 - Confrontation on Mt. Carmel
 1 Kings 18
- Translated into Heaven 2 Kings 2

Confrontation on Mt. Carmel

1 Kings 18

- "And Elijah came unto all the people, and said, How long halt ye between two opinions? if the LORD be God, follow him: but if Baal, then follow him. And the people answered him not a word."
- Challenged Baal to match altars and sacrifices
- Mocked them openly...
- After dousing him 3 times with water, called fire down and consumed his offering
- ... then slaughtered the 450 prophets of Baal.

Queen Jezebel

- Daughter of Ethbaal, king of Sidonians
- Wife of King Ahab of Israel 1 Kings 16
- Synonymous with crafty, cruel, malicious
- Naboth's vineyard acquired for Ahab through an inquisition, false accusation, and execution

Elisha

- Elisha became Elijah's disciple
 - Elijah did 8 specific miracles
 - Raptured
 - Prophesied to return Mal 4:5 / Rev 11
- Elisha requests a 'double portion' 2 Kings 2:9
- Elijah grants this request if he sees him go
- Elisha follows faithfully & receives this anointing...
- …and does 16 miracles

Naaman Cleansed

- Gentile leper (idiom of sin)
 2 Kings 5
- Proud and unwilling to submit to God
- Eventually humbles himself & is 'baptised' (dying to self)
- Raised to new life
- Now in the world but not of it
- His real home is no longer this world
- Daily challenges faced (before unbelieving gentiles) but not giving in to compromise

A Glimpse of Spiritual Warfare

Then the king of Syria warred against Israel, and took counsel with his servants, saying, In such and such a place shall be my camp.

2 Kings 6:8

Inside Intelligence Resource

And the man of God (Elisha) sent unto the King of Israel, saying, "Beware that thou pass not such a place; for thither the Syrians are come down."

And the King of Israel sent to the place which the man of God told him and warned him of, and saved himself there, not once nor twice.

The Search for the Mole

Therefore the heart of the king of Syria was sore troubled for this thing; and he called his servants, and said unto them, "Will ye not show me which of us is for the king of Israel?"

2 Kings 6:11

The Secret Resource

And one of his servants said, "None, my lord, O king: but Elisha, the prophet that is in Israel, telleth the king of Israel the words that thou speakest in thy bedchamber."

The Preparation to Attack

And he said, Go and spy where he is, that I may send and fetch him. And it was told him, saying, "Behold, he is in Dothan." Therefore sent he thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by night, and compassed the city about.

Threat Assessment: Physical

And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots. And his servant said unto him, "Alas, my master! how shall we do?"

The Defenses Revealed

And Elisha prayed, and said, "Lord, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see."

And the Lord opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha.

The Fall of Israel

For the children of Israel walked in all the sins of Jeroboam which he did; they departed not from them; ²³ Until the LORD removed Israel out of his sight, as he had said by all his servants the prophets. So was Israel carried away out of their own land to Assyria unto this day.

2 Kings 17:22-23

The Fall of Israel

- 722 B.C. Israel is conquered by Assyria
- The people are taken away captive
- The king of Assyria fills the land with migrants
- The land becomes overrun with lions
- A 'priest' is sent back to teach the customs to the new inhabitants (Samaritans)
- They form a hybrid religion
- Subsequently rejected by the 'Jews'

Birth of the Samaritans

24 And the king of Assyria brought men from Babylon, and from Cuthah, and from Ava, and from Hamath, and from Sepharvaim, and placed them in the cities of Samaria instead of the children of Israel: and they possessed Samaria, and dwelt in the cities thereof.

2 Kings 17:24

Lion Invasion

²⁵ And so it was at the beginning of their dwelling there, that they feared not the LORD: therefore the LORD sent lions among them, which slew some of them. 26 Wherefore then spake to the king of Assyria, saying, The nations which thou hast removed, and placed in the cities of Samaria, know not the manner of the God of the land: therefore be bath sent lions among them, and, behold, then slan them, because then know not the manner of the God of the land.

Royal Lion Hunts

In 2 Chron 36.9, he is said to be only eight years of age, but this must be a mistake; for we find that, having reigned only three months, he was carried captive to Babylon, and there he had wives; and it is very improbable that a child between eight and nine years of age could have wives; and of such a tender age, it can scarcely be said that, as a king, he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord. The place in Chronicles must be corrupted"
