

- ἀριθμὸ *Arithmoi*, "Numbers" (LXX) *Numeri* (Latin) *B'midbar*, "In the Wilderness."
- Covers 38 years from
 - -the giving of the Law at Sinai
 - —to the eve of the Conquest
- Chronicle of successes and failures of the "Wilderness Wanderings."

Where Is the Fruit?


- A. An intimate relationship with someone other than the one you are espoused to

Order In The Camp

40 Let all things be done decently and in order.

1 Cor 14:40

² Take ye the sum of all the congregation of the children of Israel, after their families, by the house of their fathers, with the number of their names, every male by their polls;

From twenty years old and upward, all that are able to go forth to war in Israel: thou and Aaron shall number them by their armies.

- 4 And with you there shall be a man of every tribe; every one head of the house of his fathers.
- 5 And these are the names of the men that shall stand with you...

The Leaders of Israel

- Moses is told that God has chosen the "men who shall stand with you"
- What of Jethro's Advice 1 year earlier?
- Roughly 600,000 men = 78,060 judges
- Only two men of those who left Egypt entered the Promised Land
- Man's wisdom vs. God's wisdom

44 These are those that were numbered, which Moses and Aaron numbered, and the princes of Israel, being twelve men: each one was for the house of his fathers.
45 So were all those that were numbered of the children of Israel, by the house of their fathers, from twenty years old and upward, all that were able to go forth to war in Israel;

Fifty [603,550].


God's promise to Jacob


Israel's Growth in Egypt

 - Men of War 20 yrs old & above 603,550









Rabbinical Precision

- The Camp of Judah: East of Levites
- The Camp of Reuben: South of Levites
- Strict obedience denies area Southeast
- Thus, only cardinal directions ordained
- Only width of Levite's camp allowed
- Length proportional to population

 The underlying theme is the sanctification and cleansing of the church



Sanctification of the Camp

- And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
- ² Command the children of Israel, that they put out of the camp every leper, and every one that hath an issue, and whosoever is defiled by the dead:
- Both male and female shall ye put out, without the camp shall ye put them; that they defile not their camps, in the midst whereof I dwell.


Numbers 5:1-3

- Leper = Un-addressed sin (Ps 66:18 / 1 Cor 5:5)
- Issue = Unchanged heart (Matt 15:11-20)
- Defiled by the dead = tainted by the world (1 John 2:15)

4 And the children of Israel did so, and put them out without the camp: as the LORD spake unto Moses, so did the children of Israel.

Numbers 5:4

- A healthy body rejects the poison from its system...
- So a healthy church will do likewise (Rev 3:16)



The Nazarite Vow

- The word Nazirite means "Separate"
- This is an act of sanctification



Accidental Defilement

- Everything of the former achievements is lost
- There is NO building up of equity of righteousness with God

- Recovering of lost ground is hard



Chapter 8

The Lampstand & Levites

- And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
- ² Speak unto Aaron, and say unto him, When thou lightest the lamps, the seven lamps shall give light over against the candlestick.
- 3 And Aaron did so; he lighted the lamps thereof over against the candlestick, as the LORD commanded Moses.

Numbers 8:1-3

4 And this work of the candlestick was of beaten gold, unto the shaft thereof, unto the flowers thereof, was beaten work: according unto the pattern which the LORD had shewed Moses, so he made the candlestick.

The Lampstand

- Only source of light in the Tabernacle
- Without the holy oil it could not give light
- One lampstand (1= number of God)
- With six branched (6= number of man)
- The Lampstand is a vessel to "hold up the Light" in the darkness
- Jesus Himself says it is representative of the Church (Rev 1:20)


The Lampstand

- Only Design given (No Dimensions/limit)
- Made of Pure Gold (refined)
- Made from "one talent of beaten Gold"
 - church is one body
 - church formed through trials
- Talent = 75-120 pounds in weight
- Mystery how it could support itself
- It needed supernatural strengthening



The Lampstand

- The Light comes from the Oil
 - symbol of the Holy Spirit
- The Lampstand is a vessel to "hold up the Light" in the darkness
- Rev 1:20 the Church



Chapter 9

Remember were we began!

And the LORD spake unto Moses in the wilderness of Sinai, in the first month of the second year after they were come out of the land of Egypt, saying,

2 Let the children of Israel also keep the passover at

his appointed season.

In the fourteenth day of this month, at even, ye shall keep it in his appointed season: according to all the rites of it, and according to all the ceremonies thereof, shall ye keep it.

Numbers 9:1-3

- 4 And Moses spake unto the children of Israel, that they should keep the passover.
- 5 And they kept the passover on the fourteenth day of the first month at even in the wilderness of Sinai: according to all that the LORD commanded Moses, so did the children of Israel.

Numbers 9:4-5

Keeping The Passover

- What did the Passover represent?
- The deliverance from slavery
- Freedom bought with the blood of a lamb
- A continual reminder that their freedom was not earned
- Never loose sight of where it began
- Remembering the Passover assured them of their future rest

Do This in Remembrance...


- The Passover was the model of the real deliverance
 - The deliverance from sin
- Freedom bought with the blood of The Lamb
- We are to continually remember that our freedom was not earned
- Never loose sight of where it began
- Remembering the 'Communion' assures us of our future rest ('until I drink it new...')



Short Term Memories

- They rejected the bread God had provided
 - A type of the Word (John 6:31-51)
- Desiring to be back in Egypt
 - A type of the world
- They had 'forgotten' the task masters
 - All male children were to be killed (Ex 1:16)
 - They had cried out to the LORD (Ex 2:23)

Short Term Memories

9 But now, after that ye have known God, or rather are known of God, how turn ye again to the weak and beggarly elements, whereunto ye desire again to be in bondage?

Galatians 4:9

- Have I conceived all this people? have I begotten them, that thou shouldest say unto me, Carry them in thy bosom, as a nursing father beareth the sucking child, unto the land which thou swarest unto their fathers?

- 15 And be gave them their request; but sent leanness into their soul.



Kibroth-Hattaavah

- 'The graves of lust'
- Too many fall here, never to make it to the inheritance God has for them

A Question of Liberty?


- Was Moses wrong to have an Ethiopian wife?

- The Key:

 - Moses had a liberty with the LORD




Water of Purification

Separation Mandate

There was a great problem with the children of Israel. God had taken them out of Egypt in one night. But it took God forty years to get Egypt out of them. And even now, after they had been tricked into idolatry through the advice of Balaam to the Midianites, they still bring the Midianite women into their camp. That is the problem with worldliness. It is not wrong for us to be in the world—that is where God has placed us—the great issue is whether the world is in us, in our hearts and lives.
